Confidential consultation with a healthcare professional (Pharmacist, GP) to discuss patients medications

Think of medicines as items in a backpack. Every time you are prescribed medicines or buy any supplements it's like adding another item.

When Mr. Johnson, a 75-year old man came in for a medication review, his 'backpack' was full he was on 10 different medications. He mentioned feeling tired and dizzy all the time, and assumed it was just old age.

During the review, the pharmacist discovered that two of his medicines were Interacting and causing the dizziness. Another medicine he had been taking for years wasn't even needed anymore it was originally prescribed for a condition that had long resolved.

The Pharmacist adjusted his treatment, removed unnecessary medicines and changed the timing of a few others. A month later, he came back feeling lighter - not just from carrying fewer pills, but because his energy had returned and the dizziness was gone.

That's why medication reviews matter. They're like unpacking your backpack to make sure everything inside is still helping you - not weighing you down


